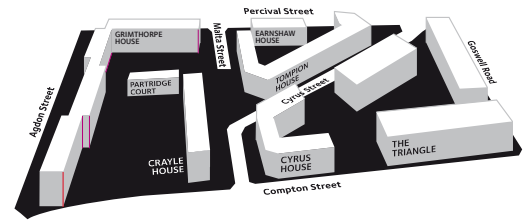


The Percival/Triangle area is improving !

EC1 New Deal for Communities, Islington Council and Homes for Islington are working in partnership to develop a plan to improve the Percival Triangle area. The plan will focus on making outdoor spaces safer, greener, cleaner and easier to use.

Talking to Residents

We have been talking to residents to understand the likes, dislikes, thoughts and concerns about the area and listening to ideas about how to make the Percival Triangle area an even better place to live. We spent a day in November walking around the area with Tenant Resident Association (TRA) members, we made presentations to TRA meetings and also held two outdoor consultation events in November to try to talk to as many people as possible about the area. Despite the cold weather, we had a very good response and spoke to almost 100 local residents about their concerns and ideas about the Percival Triangle area. Today, the design team is holding a drop-in session to discuss 6 key objectives for the area, which we understand are important to you after hearing your comments and ideas so far. These are:

- Improving Safety and Security
- Improving how Public and Private Spaces are Used
- Improving Green Space
- Improving Getting Around, Entrances and Exits
- Improving Maintenance and Management
- Improving Parking and Streets

We want to talk to you about your thoughts on the proposals in front of you today. Your comments will help us understand which ideas should be developed further.

What Happens Next

After today, we will develop our ideas, taking on board comments you make. These more detailed proposals will be presented on Saturday, 23 February at the Finsbury Library where we will again invite you to look at these plans and comment.

The proposals will identify what improvements can and should take place at an early stage and which ones will happen in the long term. This plan will ensure that improvements will work towards a common goal for the area and will help us to get more funding to make more things happen.
